Ludlow Rotary Tree of Light to Shine as a Beacon of Remembrance

Once again, this Christmas, the Ludlow Rotary Club offers everyone the opportunity to shine a light in memory of a loved one, to celebrate a special occasion or to send good wishes to friends or family by making a dedication and donation.

A Tree of Light, organised by the town's Rotarians, has been part of the Ludlow Christmas for almost two decades.

At 6.45pm on Friday 22 November members of the public are invited to join a torch light procession led by the Rocksprings Community Choir across the Market Square to the Tree of Light, located in Castle Gardens. The Tree of Light will be switched on at 7pm by the Mayor of Ludlow, Councillor Beverley Waite, and the tree will remain lit until Twelfth Night on 6 January.

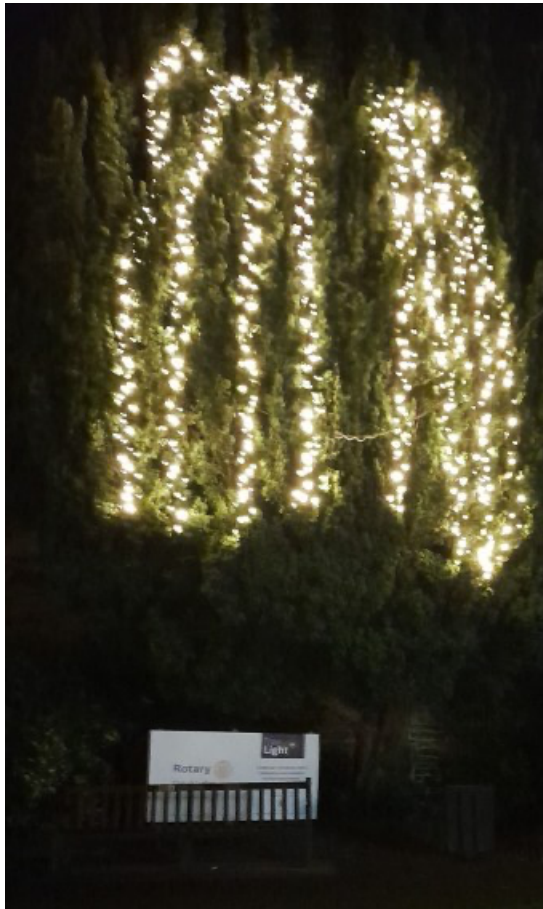
